





INTRODUCTION

Women Medical College, Abbottabad is the only female medical college in the private sector in Pakistan. The College was established as it was felt that a large number of females, willing to acquire medical education were unable to do so because of multiple factors, including our socio-cultural system which does not allow females to study in co-educational environment as the number of female medical colleges are very limited in public as well as in private sector throughout the country. So it was realized that there was a dire need to establish a female medical college. We accepted the challenge and selected an ideal site to start Women Medical College, which is situated in the scenic town of Abbottabad about 05 km from the heart of the city off Murree Road. The calm and quiet atmosphere, abundant greenery and cool shades provide congenial and an ideally suitable environment for learning. The college is housed in a historic building locally known in the city as "HOTI PALACE" which is spread over an area of 50 kanals. Almost 60% of the area is covered by the campus building i.e. old and new and the rest 40% is comprising of lush green lawns, garden and playgrounds within the premises for the students under strict security measures.

In 1999, a faculty of medicine was established.

Keeping in view the rules and regulations of Pakistan Medical & Dental Council and Khyber Medical University Peshawar the College's administration maintains a high standard of medical and dental education by inducting highly competent teaching staff, assuring superior training and patient care. The College is fully accredited by the Khyber Medical University, the examining and degree awarding university and is listed as one of the recognized medical college of Pakistan by Pakistan Medical & Dental Council. Women Medical College is recognized by College of Physicians & Surgeons Pakistan (CPSP) for postgraduate fellowship programmes in medical departments.

The College continues a commitment to impart medical and dental experience particularly in bringing together students from diverse background. The College enrolls annually 100 students in MBBS programme.



Today, Women Medical College is nationally and internationally recognized for its undergraduate programmes in medical discipline. The 1st batch of medical graduates passed out in 2005 and by the end of academic session 2022, 1544 medical graduates have completed their education.

Benazir Bhutto Shaheed (DHQ) Teaching Hospital Abbottabad, a 500 bedded hospital and newly constructed 250 bedded own Women Medical College teaching hospital named Jinnah International Hospital Abbottabad are affiliated with Women Medical College Abbottabad. These are well equipped with latest diagnostic facilities.

The College has spacious lecture halls and latest audiovisual teaching aids, well equipped laboratories, computer lab, museums a huge library having latest textbooks, reference books, medical journals etc and provision to provide access to internet and websites. In addition to main library, one library is located in Benazir Bhutto Shaheed (DHQ) Teaching Hospital Abbottabad.

The college building comprises of Administration Block and Academic Blocks. The Administration Block includes offices of Principal, Managing Director, Director Academics, Vice Principal, Establishment Branch, H.R Section, Conference Room, Department of Medical Education, Offices of Director Finance, Accounts Section, Students Affairs Section, Provost Office, Visitors Rooms, Telephone Exchange, Bookshop and Mosque whereas Academic Block comprises of departments of Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, Pathology, Pharmacology, Forensic Medicine, Community Medicine with demonstration rooms, dissection hall, laboratories and museum. Beside these the other facilities include Lecture Halls, Main Auditorium, Computer Lab, Skill Lab, Library, Tutorial Rooms, Cafeteria and Gymnasium.

Benazir Bhutto Shaheed Hospital (DHQ) and Women & Children Hospital are attached with the Women Medical College under a KPK Govt. Public Private Partnership Agreement. BBS Hospital is a reputed teaching hospital, to which Ayub Medical College Abbottabad had been affiliated for more than 20 years.

These two hospitals collectively have more than 500 beds and their OPDs have been catering one thousand patients per day.

Women Medical College has its own 250 bedded teaching hospital in the name of Jinnah International Hospital Abbottabad, located within the premises of WMC with latest and sophisticated equipment like Laproscope & Hysteroscope, diagnostic & operative, Calposcope, Ultrasound with vaginal probe for Gynae, Ventilators for neonatal & adults, Cardiac machine, Pulse Oximeter, Ultrasonic Nebulizer, Audiogram, CT Scan, Floroscopy, Digital X-ray, Multimedia & Image Intensifier, Bronchoscopy and Endoscopy etc.

It is a national statutory body of the country that regulates the Medical Profession in general and monitor the medical education in particular. The College was initially recognized for 50 students in the year 2003 by PM&DC and thereafter in year 2007, for admission of 100 students per year purely on its meritorious grounds of teaching and training.

The KMU was established in January 2007 and is the first Medical University of Health Sciences in Khyber Pukhtunkhawa. The University conducts professional examinations in MBBS and BDS. In addition the university conducts the postgraduate, nursing, medical technology and physiotherapy exam. The university has a mandate to uplift the medical education not only nationally but internationally. All Medical & Dental colleges of public & private sector of K.P.K are affiliated with KMU.

CRITERIA FOR SESSION 2023-24

The following Admission Policy is framed in compliance with the provisions of Section 17(3) of Pakistan Medical & Dental Council Act 2022 dated 16-1-2023 and PM&DC Medical and Dental Undergraduate Education (Admission Curriculum and Conduct) Policy & Regulations 2023 dated 13th July 2023, for admission of students to Women Medical & Dental College, Abbottabad for MBBS/BDS courses.

Eligibility Criteria

Any candidate seeking admission in Women Medical College, Abbottabad shall only be eligible fulfilling the following compulsory criteria.

Pakistani Students

- i. Obtained a higher Secondary School Certificate qualification (HSSC) or an Equivalent 12th Grade qualification recognized in Pakistan and having obtained a minimum of sixty percent marks therein.
- ii. Has passed the mandatory subjects of Biology, Chemistry and Physics or Mathematics in the HSSC or an equivalent examination recognized in Pakistan.
- iii. Passed MDCAT examination as per PM&DC regulation - 2023

MDCAT Passing percentage for session 2023-24

MBBS: 55%
BDS: 50%

The result of MDCAT-2022 are no longer valid for seeking admission in Session 2023.

Foreign/Overseas Quota Seats

- i. Private Medical & Dental institutions may admit students on Foreign/Overseas quota seats upto fifteen percent of their total annual seats.
- ii. No candidate shall be eligible for Foreign/Overseas quota unless holds a permanent foreign nationality or overseas Pakistani who has studied and passes HSSC 12th grade examination or equivalent from outside Pakistan and is resident of foreign country at the time of applying for admission.
- iii. Mandatory requirement of MDCAT shall not apply to students seeking admission to foreign, overseas Pakistani. Foreign students, overseas/ dual nationality holder shall qualify SATII with minimum 550 score in each subject OR a foreign MCAT OR UCAT exam with 50% marks in the subjects prescribed under II above.
- iv. Where any seat of Foreign/Overseas quota remains vacant due to unavailability of eligible candidate it shall stand transferred to open merit quota.

Merit List

1. In case final merit of more than one candidate is equal up to four decimals, the candidate older in age shall stand higher in merit;
2. Merit lists will be notified / displayed after the closure of submission of application for admission.
3. After the display of final merit list if there is any vacant seat, the next candidate on merit in the waiting list will be offered admission accordingly.
4. Candidates can make written representation at college admission online portal through e-mail (info@wmc.edu.pk) against any error, omissions, mistakes in the merit list.

ADMISSION PROCESS

1. The Applicants will apply through online portal of WM&DC within specified date and time.
2. Interim merit list will be displayed on website as and when necessary, during the process of admission.
3. Final admission list will be made public by or before 31st Jan 2024 for MBBS and by or before 28th Feb 2024 for BDS and sent to authority for review.
4. The applicants are directed to visit college website regularly for updated information / notifications.

5. All correspondences to the applicant will be carried out through email provided by the applicant.
6. All selected candidates will be required to submit their original documents at the time of admission and it should be treated as mandatory.
7. All selected candidates and their parents / guardian will be required to provide an affidavit on stamp paper of Rs. 100 duly attested by the notary public on format provided by the college.
8. Admission offer will remain provisional subject to verification of documents, medical fitness and fee submitted within the prescribed period.
9. The applicants must upload the following documents at a time of applying for admission.

 - b. HSSC / IBCC equivalent certificate
 - c. Domicile certificate.

 - h. MDCAT / SAT II / MCAT / UCAT result.
 - i. Equivalence certificate from IBCC (incase of foreign qualification)

It is mandatory for selected candidates to pay college dues within three working days. Otherwise failure to do so her admission offer shall stand cancelled and next candidate on merit will be offered admission.

EXAMINATION RULES

Evaluation is an essential components of education process. In order to achieve this there are regular internal evaluations. The students are evaluated in knowledge (cognitive domain), skills (psychomotor domain) and beliefs and attitudes (affective domain). The principles of internal evaluation are uniformly applied in a transparent manner. The purpose of evaluation is

- a. To get feed back of the students about their understanding of subject material. This purpose is achieved by periodic internal evaluation of each chapter/ topic of course.
- b. To certify that the students have successfully completed the training and have achieved objectives of educational programme.
- c. To motivate and encourage the students to direct their own learning.
- d. To achieve these objective we adopt the following processes.
 - (i). The students are continuously assessed at the end of a module, term, stage, chapter in the form of class tests, stage and term examination (Mid Term and Setup Exams). Proper record of marks obtained in internal assessments in theory & practicals are maintained and the scores obtained in these tests, stages etc contribute 10% of the final score of student in the annual/ supplementary University Examination of each subject.
 - (ii). Whatever may be the system of marking for all examinations throughout medical & dental course the passing percentage of marks in each subject is not less than 50% i.e 50% in theory and 50% in practical.
 - (iii). If a student fails in theory/ practical in any of the examining subject, she will be considered failed in that subject(s). She will reappear in both theory as well as practical in the said subject(s) in her next examination.
 - (iv). To appear in any professional examination the student must complete 75% of her attendance in each subject as per rules of Pakistan Medical & Dental Council and Khyber Medical University, Peshawar. No student is eligible for a university examination without having attended 75% of lectures, demonstrations, tutorials, practical and clinical work in lab, inpatient and outpatient. Only those medical leave certificate would be accepted that to be issued by the consultant of Jinnah International Hospital Abbottabad except in extreme emergency. A fine of Rs.200/- per day will be imposed on account of absence from class.
 - (v). Only two examinations are conducted in an academic session for a professional exam i.e. Annual & Supplementary Examinations as prescribed by PMDC and Khyber Medical University, Peshawar. No extra examination is allowed in the form of special supplementary examination etc.
 - (vi). The student, who appears in Annual/ Supply examination are provisionally allowed to attend their next higher class till the declaration of results of Annual/ Supply examination of previous class. This is being done to help and provide maximum support and benefit to the students because:
 - a. The university results of different professional examinations are usually delayed and their precious time is saved.
 - b. After passing the supplementary examination of previous class the student will not face any deficiency in the courses of their next class.
 - c. And they will not face shortage of attendance, which make them ineligible to appear in the next professional examination according to University rules.
 - (vii). No student can be promoted to next higher class unless she passes all the subjects of previous class.
 - (viii). The Provisional admission does not make her eligible to appear in two different examinations in one academic session.
 - (ix). A student, who reappears in her previous class professional examination in annual/ supply, is not eligible to appear in new class professional examination in the same academic year.

The candidate interested to get admission in Women Medical College must ensure that her parents/ guardian are financially sound and can pay the college and hostel dues during her stay in five years before the start of next Academic session and will not default at any stage due to shortage of finances.

As you are aware of the fact that the professional education especially medical education is quite costly and demands tremendous amount of hard work with a determinant sense of commitment to learning the profession and any kind of interruption during the period of learning and getting professional training cannot be afforded.. Not only that the teaching is costly but the hospital training on the clinical side is much more costly. It is estimated that to train a medical graduate in our country in Govt. medical college cost the government approximately more than Rs. Eight millions while the cost is manifold for such training abroad especially in developed countries like U.S.A and U.K.

As the college is running on self finance basis, so it becomes imperative for the admitted students to pay the college dues well in time and in full amount. Payment in installments is not acceptable. However, students who show up outstanding performance during their course of study e.g. securing top positions in professional examination in the university may get a financial help or monitory awards as decided by the committee from time to time.

RULES REGARDING PAYMENT OF COLLEGE DUES

1. All the students must pay their dues after annual examination before the start of new academic session. Those who fail to deposit their fees within the stipulated period, a fine of Rs.500/- per day will be charged in addition to the college fee and other subscriptions. All those students who fail to comply with this rule will not be allowed to attend her classes/lab/OPD/ wards etc or appear in examination may be expelled from the hostel.
2. All new entrants including migrated students will pay the college dues/ fees and other subscription for the class in which they seek admission.
3. If the security deposited is not claimed within a period of 6-months of the date of leaving the college, then it shall not be refundable and will be credited to the benevolent fund, maintained by the college for deserving students.
4. If she passes in supplementary examination then her admission to higher class would be regularized. Otherwise she should undergo the courses of her studies in the class/ subject(s) in which has been declared failed. Then she would be required to pay her readmission fee alongwith other college dues etc for the class in which she has been detained due to her failure in subject(s) in both Annual & Supplementary examination.

SCHOLARSHIPS:

The college has established a provision for scholarship to support the needy and disabled students on meritorious basis. In case of breach of any discipline the scholarship will be withheld.

AWARDS

Any student who secure 1st position in the university in a professional examination will enjoy a 50% reduction in tuition fee for the coming year.

RESEARCH AT WOMEN MEDICAL COLLEGE

The teaching Faculty of Women Medical College are full time employees. Besides teaching the faculty is actively involved in Research, which is given due importance in Women Medical College and also culture is being developed amongst the students to involve themselves in Research as early as possible.

Research cell has been established in Women Medical College in year 2006 and has been working under the patronage of Principal Prof. Dr. Salma Aslam Kundi.

Research projects has been initiated since inception of College. Many of these have been completed and others are in progress. This research cell provides a platform for research especially for postgraduate qualification and in general undergraduates. Proper guidance is being provided by eminent teachers, research scholars from amongst our own faculty. This research cell offers the opportunity of learning through workshops to the staff of Women Medical College and also to the teachers from other medical institutions.

STUDENTS AFFAIRS SECTION

It is one of the section of Women Medical College, which deals with the academic affairs of the student right from date of their admission till leaving the college as graduates. The section offers the following services to the students and graduates.

1. Involved in process of admission e.g. issuance and receiving the admission forms/ applications.
2. Preparing class time tables, allotment of roll number and batches for theory, practical and clinical programmes.
3. All correspondence with the parents, university and PMDC regarding their progress during academic sessions, registration and examination affairs etc.
4. Keeping all the records of the students e.g. attendance, results, class test, examinations results etc.
5. Helping the students in their day to day problems, related to migration, examinations, issuance of academic & provincial certificates etc.

LIBRARY

WMDC has got a rich and rapidly expanding library, located within college premises. The Library has an excellent collection of textbooks, general books, reference books and reputed national and international medical and research journals. The students are instructed to observe the following rules:

1. All the students, on admission, should get library membership cards. If the original card is lost, a duplicate/ triplicate is issued at the cost of Rs.100/- and cost of Rs.200/- respectively.
2. The members are allowed to borrow two books (Textbooks/ General Books) from Library. No reference books or medical journal is issued to students.
3. Books are issued for a period of three months after which the books should be returned and can be reissued for another three months. A fine will be imposed if the book(s) is/are kept overdue.
4. The members shall not mutilate/ damage by writing/ making photocopies of pages of books issued to them. The defaulter will be required to pay the cost of book(s).
5. The students will be required to submit a clearance certificate in the Student's Affairs Section prior to her examination/ leaving the college.
6. Complete silence and order should be maintained in library. Eating, sleeping, gossiping and use of cell phones in library is strictly prohibited.
7. The following timing will be observed

Summer: 08:00am to 11:00pm
Winter: 08:00am to 11:00pm
All days except Saturday and Sunday.



SICK ROOM

A sick room is available within the college premises providing emergency treatment. The serious cases are referred to Jinnah International Hospital, Abbottabad adjacent to college & hostel.

COMPUTER LAB.

A well established computer lab is utilized by the students during working hours.



CAFETERIA

To cater the staff and students around the clock we have a standard cafeteria within College premises.

MAIN AUDITORIUM

For all university examinations, cocurricular and recreational activities an auditorium, having a capacity of Over 500 people is built within college premises.

HOSTELS

Hostel accommodation is provided to all those who require. Women Medical & Dental College have two hostels, which offer comfortable accommodation. The facilities include shared accommodation in bedrooms, nice sitting rooms and hygienic kitchens with capacious dinning halls and furnished common room for indoor games. A canteen adjacent to hostel. Cold and hot water facilities are provided. The security staff is very vigilant and hostel rules are strictly followed. All the hostels have a robust security system. Female workers and "Aya" serve the students, clean the rooms and wash their clothes. In order to make the hostels secured and vigilant, ex-servicemen are deputed as security guards.

Female wardens are living within the premises of hostel to maintain the discipline and to assist the students.

A provost from amongst the college teaching staff looks after the day-to-day problems of boarders and makes the policies of allotment, food, security, games and recreations for the boarders. Beside he is responsible to provide medical help to the students as and when required. If any student needs specialist advice or hospitalization, the provost is responsible to make all necessary arrangements besides informing the parents at the earliest.

These two hostels are:-

Campus Hostel

This hostel is situated within the premises of Women Medical College adjacent to college auditorium, library and canteen. It faces a lush green lawn and a garden which is a place of enjoyment in the afternoon or evening to relax after the exhaustive studies of the day. The hostel has the capacity to accommodate 700 boarders.



Abbott Hostel

This hostel is situated on Mansehra Road of Abbottabad city. It is hardly 02km from the college campus. Pick and drop facility is readily available. All other facilities are provided as for other above stated hostels.





Rules & Regulations



1. Student seeking admission to hostel shall apply for a seat on the prescribed form available from the college office.
2. Seats shall be allotted by the Provost according to the Policy and subject to the availability of seat.
3. College authorities are NOT bound to provide hostel accommodation to each and every student.
4. The available accommodation will be given on 1st come 1st served basis.
5. Special consideration by the hostel committee is provided to a deserving case.
6. Student seeking admission in the hostel will have to deposit the hostel dues alongwith other dues in advance to the college finance department.
7. Hostel will remain closed during winter vacation in the months of January and February for Annual maintenance and repair.
8. No student is allowed to use air conditioner in the room.
9. Boarders are required to read and strictly follow the rules and regulations of hostel given in details in the hostel booklet.
10. Boarders will be provided pick and drop facility by the college authorities on paid request only on official holidays to bus stop and hostel.
11. Room or hostel already allocated to the student can be changed at any time during the tenure of studies.



Fee Structure for Batch 2025-2026




